This is an exciting opportunity for someone who is passionate about preserving the natural resources within the traditional territory of the First Nation and in supporting the Implementation process. The Nacho Nyak Dun First Nation citizens praise themselves on living and practicing traditional values.

THE OPPORTUNITY

Reporting to the Director you will be responsible for the development; delivery and administration of lands, fisheries, wildlife and other resources for the First Nation of Na-Cho Nyak Dun [FNNND]. You will play a key role in supporting negotiations and ongoing implementation activities for FNNND Final and Self-Government Agreements as it relates to lands and resources. The position involves supervision of Lands staff, working closely with FNNND Council and the implementation team.

You will often need to deal with situations of conflict and value differences when addressing issues within the Department and within the First Nation. The job involves writing position papers to Council for approval on the issues, including corporate development proposals, Final Agreement Review negotiations, etc.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

We are looking for someone who achieves organizational results by encouraging and supporting the contribution of others and leads by example. You will demonstrate a solid commitment to and respect for the spirit and core values of the FNNND organization, setting an example of professionalism and ethical propriety. People development is a key role in this position involving the development of others through coaching, mentoring, managing performance with a genuine desire to help others succeed.

YOUR QUALIFICATIONS

Ideally, you will possess a degree in Environmental Planning, Resource Management or Diploma in a similar field with three years of experience. Equivalent combinations of training and experience will be considered. An in-depth knowledge of UFA, FNNND Final and Self-Government Agreements and a thorough understanding of the political, organizational and socio-economic aspirations for the Yukon First Nations is necessary.

Good wilderness travel skills and a willingness to be in the field during all seasons are required. Your decision-making, team development skills will be key to your success in this position.

The salary range for this position is \$78, 644.00 – \$114, 452.00 per year [\$ 40.19 – \$ 58.50 per hour]. The FNNND offers a comprehensive benefit package.
